Your material should be original; otherwise, sources must be referenced. While some topics may be challenging and provide an opportunity for lively discussion, your content must be respectful and appropriate for all participants in the animal welfare community.

To keep the conference accessible and costs low for all of our participants, Texas Unites does not pay speaking fees or travel expenses for speakers. If selected as a conference speaker, you will gain visibility in the industry and contribute to the advancement of our profession. Speakers are provided a complimentary conference registration that includes several meals and entry to workshops and special events.

PROPOSAL FORMAT

Proposals will be accepted through September 30, 2024. Please submit your proposal using our online form: Submit your proposals here! You will be asked to attach the following:

- one paragraph workshop description
- one paragraph bio for each speaker in the presentation
- headshot for each speaker in the presentation
- list of previous events or groups for which you have spoken

Presentations should last one hour. Multi-session and multi-speaker presentations are welcome.

SELECTION PROCESS

Proposals are reviewed by a committee of animal welfare professionals from across the state and selections will be made in the fall months. You will be notified of the status of your proposal by the end of December.
